Day Schedule for OHSRA Provincial Finals Rodeo

Saturday, July 17, 2021

10:00 am – Ontario High School Rodeo start time for 1st Go

Come on out early to see what Junior and High School Rodeo looks like and cheer on the contestants! (Check-in at front gate as per standard Covid protocols.) Roping dummies for goat tying and steer roping will be set-up for practice.

12:30 pm – Approximate end time of OHSRA 1st Rodeo

1:00 pm – Ontario Little Buckaroos start to gather on grass area.

Please bring your original signed forms, *with notary*, if required and your entry fee if not pre-paid. Contestants should have their back numbers on when on the grounds. You will also pickup your back number if you did not previously receive one. Instruction and practice available in the dummy roping and goat tying events.

1:30 pm – Approximate start time of the Dummy Roping and Dummy Goat Tying.

Mandatory meeting for all Ontario Little Buckaroos contestants. Listen for announcement. The dummy roping will be held outside of the rodeo arena on the grass. All contestants are invited to try it out whether you registered for it or not!

2:00 pm – Start time of OHSRA 2nd Rodeo (get your horses ready!)

The Ontario Little Buckaroos barrel racing, pole bending and calf riding contestants will be competing in the OHSRA 2nd Go Rodeo. Please refer to OHSRA running order for details.

4:30 pm – Approximate end time of OHSRA 2nd Rodeo

5:00pm – Annual General Meeting, all welcome. We will be looking for volunteers and board and event directors, so come on out! Team photo after meeting.

5:30pm – Dinner provided by Scott and Lisa Gray

6:00pm – Awards presentation for all contestants (there will be prizing for our Buckaroos so don't leave early!) *Listen for our team photo time!

There will be no food booth on site for lunch so please make sure to bring any food and drinks needed.

Please also make sure to bring proper equipment/attire. A proper fitted and certified riding helmet is required in the barrel racing and pole bending. A hockey helmet with face cage and mouth guard is required for the calf riding. Please also bring a mask for when social distancing is not possible.

This is the end of our 2020 season. The 2021 season will begin at the end of August. Look for membership forms beginning in August!
